HAITI ASSISTANCE FUND



In keeping with its mission to show compassion and solidarity toward the world's poorest people, the Emergency Relief Fund – Haiti was created in 2010 after the earthquake. The fund's specific purpose was to help religious communities and local and Canadian organizations rebuild their infrastructure so that they would be able to continue their missions and actions for the people of Haiti.

In October 2016, Haiti was hit with a strong hurricane, and the Roncalli International Foundation relaunched the Emergency Relief Fund – Haiti/Hurricane Matthew to respond to appeals from victims.

The Emergency Relief Fund – Haiti was closed in 2018. Thanks to the generosity of our invaluable partners and network, we raised a grand total of \$5,881,202. With this amount, we were able to carry out 54 projects directly associated with repairing infrastructure as well as nearly 115 other projects from our regular programming, and we are proud of the work we have accomplished. We are very grateful to our partners for their commitment, care and dedication to the Haitian people.

Unfortunately, these multiple natural disasters have left behind a fragile and impoverished population and a country that is even more vulnerable to natural disasters. Inspired by this reality and the many needs that unfortunately exceed the capacity of our regular programming, the Emergency Relief Fund – Haiti was shuttered to give way to a Haiti Assistance Fund.

Over the course of the last eight years, the Foundation has gained substantial experience in dedicated funds, and we have also built close ties with the religious network known for its credibility and commitment to improving the living conditions of the dear people of Haiti.

HELLO AFRICA!

“Every time I set foot in Africa, I am always impressed with the resilience of Africans. I am always moved by their extraordinary resourcefulness and ability to do everything, even if it’s in an artisanal way. They have the courage and temerity to live and make progress at any cost.”

Nicole Pilon, Coordinator of Organizational Support at the Foundation, went on a mission to Africa for three weeks and told us about her experience. Read her story to discover a part of Africa and learn about projects funded by the Foundation.

NICOLE’S STORY...

In January 2018, I went on a three-week mission to Africa. I travelled to Burkina Faso, the Ivory Coast and Benin. It was Harmattan season, when the dust mixes with the heat and chaos of big cities such as Ouagadougou, Abidjan and Cotonou.

The goal of my mission was to visit our partners and the projects funded by the Foundation. Three weeks is not enough time to see everything that we have funded in these three developing countries. But it still allowed us to get a sense of the daily lives of Africans and to see if there has been some development for our partners and a guarantee of some durability.

Africa is still a fascinating place, and the missionary sisters that we met are even more so. They are angels who are making miracles happen with so little. During this mission, I had many wonderful opportunities to speak with these women who are perpetually on a mission. I visited their current projects, discussed upcoming projects and talked about issues that affect these sisters daily. It was an exceptional privilege.

Amidst the chaos, these sisters manage their affairs and make progress in education, health and sustainable development in an efficient and kind way.

Mostly, I visited drilling and water tower projects. By observing these projects, I was able to identify excellent resources for contractors in this field, especially on the Ivory Coast and in Benin.

What I enjoyed the most was my visit to the Songhai centre in Benin. In fact, I had the privilege to do so thanks to Sister Michelle Parent (Sœurs des Saints Cœurs de Jésus et de Marie / Sisters of the Sacred Hearts of Jesus and Mary) who wanted me to visit the centre because she was sending one of her sisters there for a one-month training program. Songhai is a unique and innovative entrepreneurial community with an integrated development system. Not only is it a training centre, but it is also a huge farm, Technology Park, industrial park and manufacturing centre, educational space and service centre. Whether you are African, Chinese or Bolivian, you can come and take workshops on agriculture, raising animals, fish farming or biofuels. At Songhai, participants can learn about new technology, recent innovations, and also have an opportunity to acquire a new philosophy of life and work that allow them to improve their living conditions and regain their dignity, which has too often been lost. The centre is already 30 years old and several other centres like it have emerged around West Africa.

For those of you who have never been to Africa, here is a snapshot of this beautiful continent; and for those who have already visited these African countries, relive your memories through Nicole's eyes.



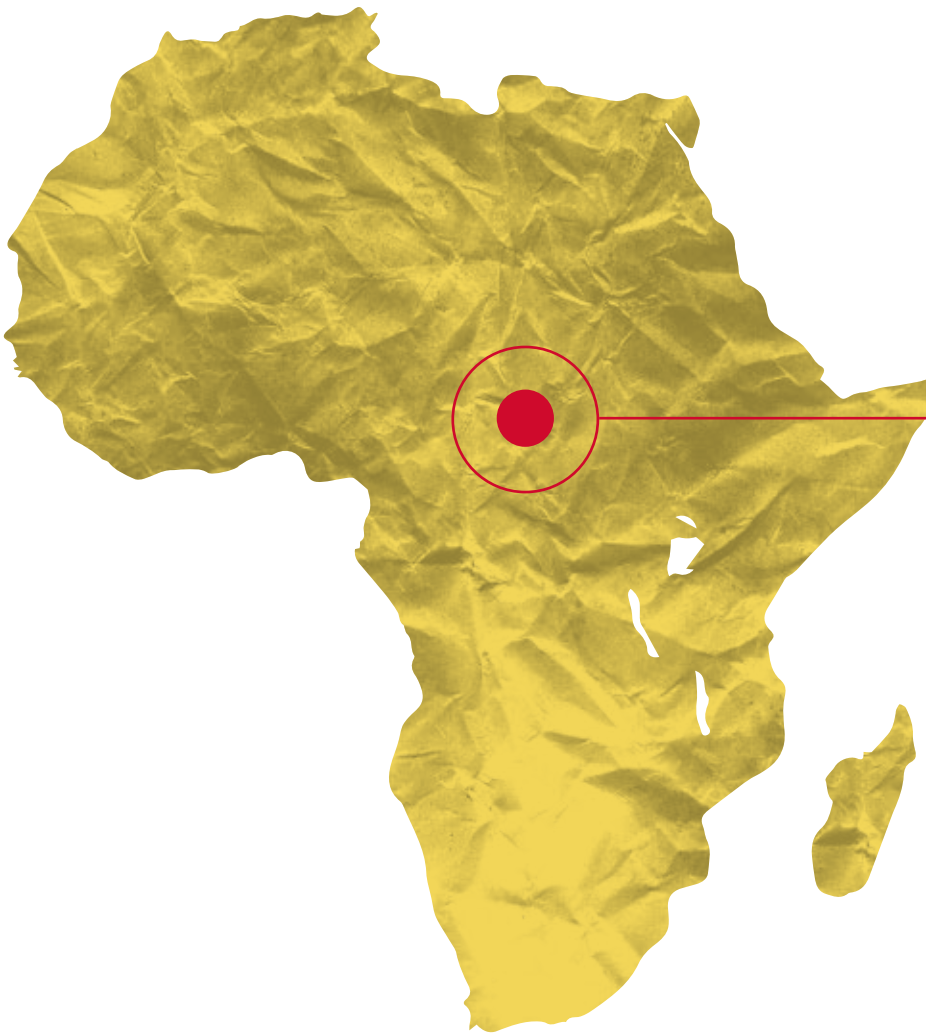

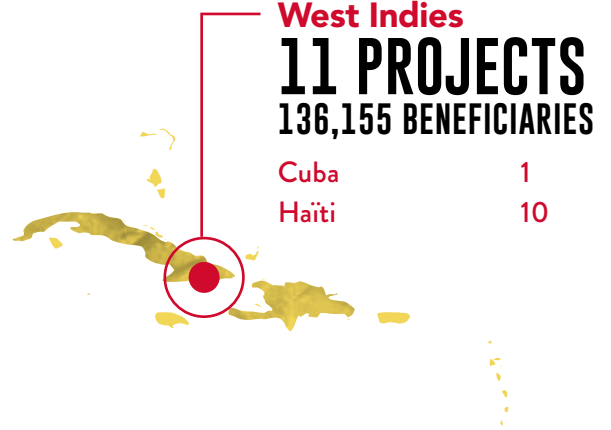

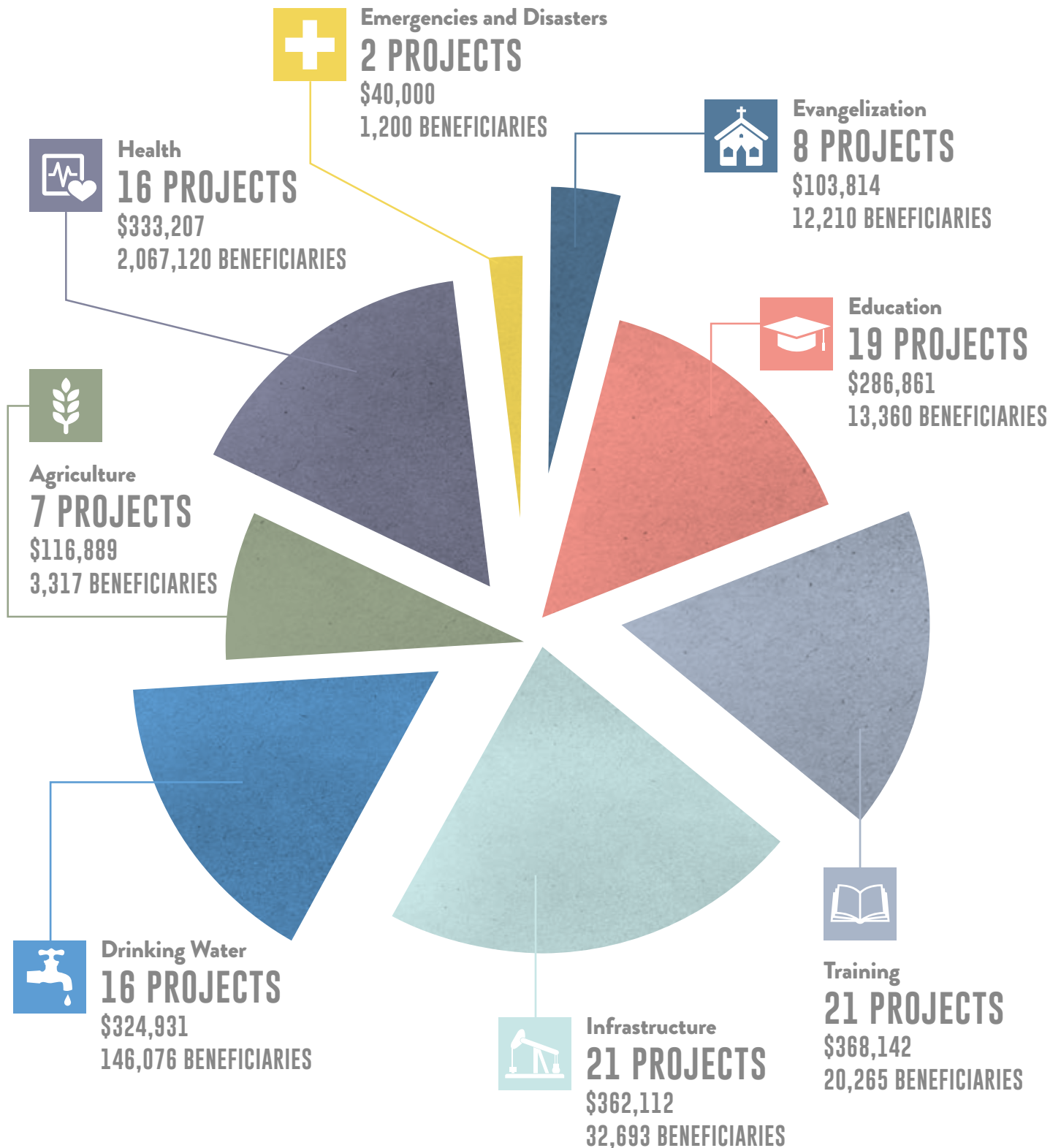
